WHY HELP?

Every year hundreds of members of our community rely on the generosity of strangers throughout the holiday season. Whether it's receiving the ingredients for a special meal, gifts for family members, or warm clothing to wear, your caring gift makes a difference in someone's life! *Holiday Connections* was created to assist individuals and groups in our community identify and select holiday giving projects.

CHOOSING A PROJECT

Whether you're part of a group or an individual who wants to help, here are some hints to help you choose the right project for yourself or your family or group:

- Look over the complete list to get an idea of what projects are available.
- Think about how many people might want to get involved, i.e. will you invite your whole company or just your department to participate?
- Think about the resources available to the people in your group and choose an option that will allow the most people to participate at some level.
- Before making a selection, talk to a few people who might be helping to see if there is a strong area of interest, such as seniors, children or animals.
- Make sure your group understands and is comfortable with any restrictions requested by the agency, such as early deadlines or not wrapping gifts.
- If you would like more information about a particular agency and what they do, or you'd like some suggestions, call The Volunteer Center at 717.732.0700.
- If possible, decide on your project by early November. This is particularly important if you choose to adopt a family. While monetary donations are always welcomed by nonprofit agencies, most attempt to find "adoptive families" for their clients by this time.
- If you happen to get a late start, don't despair. Many agencies have last-minute needs and The Volunteer Center is available to help.
- Once you've chosen a project, call the agency contact person to let them know your plans. It's
 important the agencies know in advance what you are doing so they can plan appropriately
 and avoid duplication.
- If you plan to have 10 or more people involved in your project, consider asking a few to help you with planning and spreading the word.
- Don't forget to let us know how it went! We count on your feedback to evaluate the success of the program. Just e-mail hneuhaus@uwcr.org and let us know about your experience. If available, send us a photo of your group in action, too!

Hope Within is a free primary care medical, dental and counseling clinic. We care for the members of our community that cannot access health care through their workplaces or through medical assistance for various reasons. Our patients include refugees, the working poor, single moms, students and immigrants.

Each Christmas, the agency assembles cold and flu packs that contain over-the-counter medications that our patients cannot afford such as NyQuil, Ibuprofen, vitamin supplements, Turmeric, Tylenol and other personal care products such as toothbrushes and toothpaste. We also include small personal care items such as razors, body soap and loofahs, shampoo and other necessities that are difficult for our patient population to afford. These are items that we do not budget for but we like to provide for our patients. Other needs include test strips and compatible meters for diabetics, etc.
